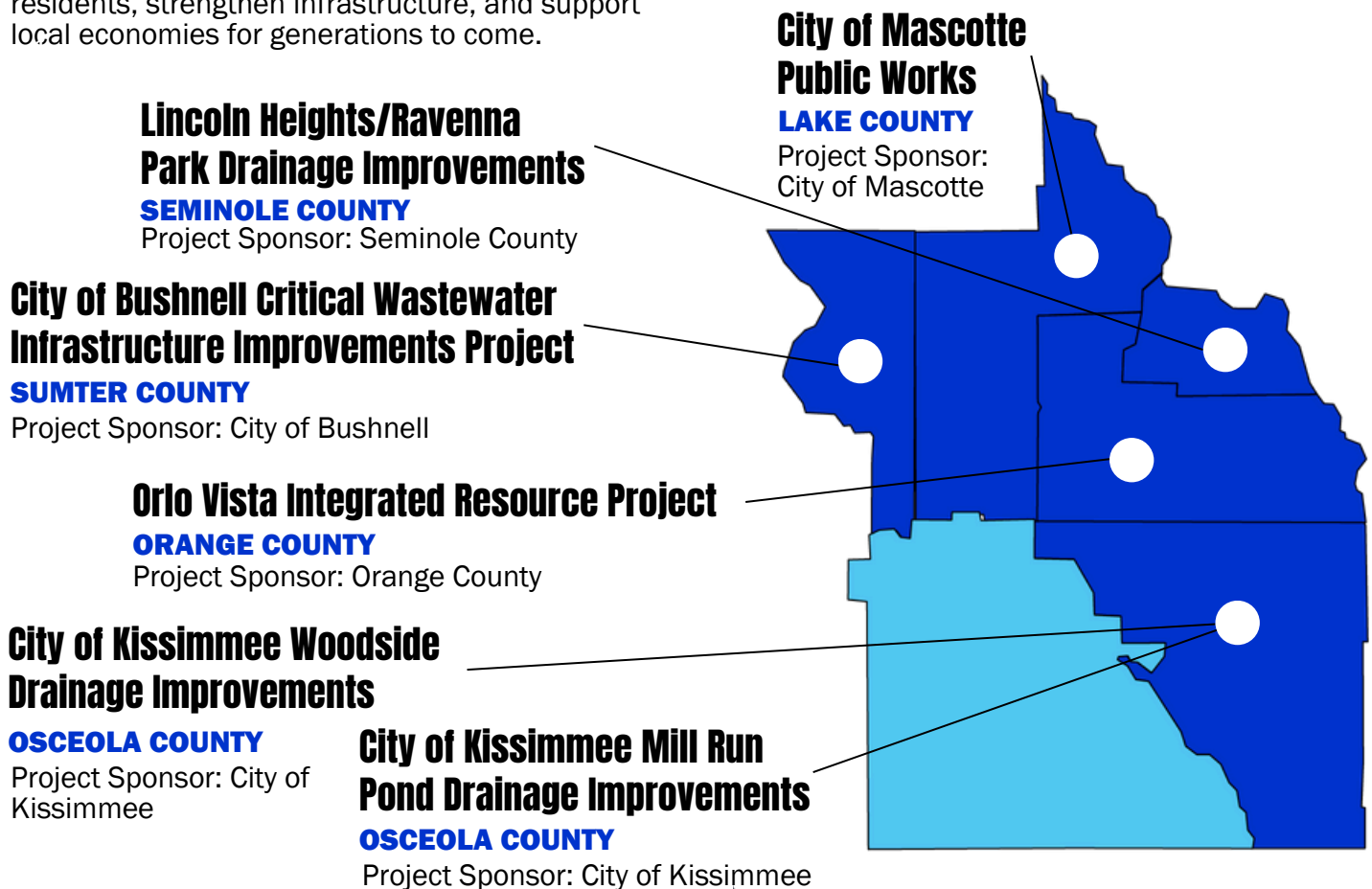


# Unfunded Resilient Florida Projects

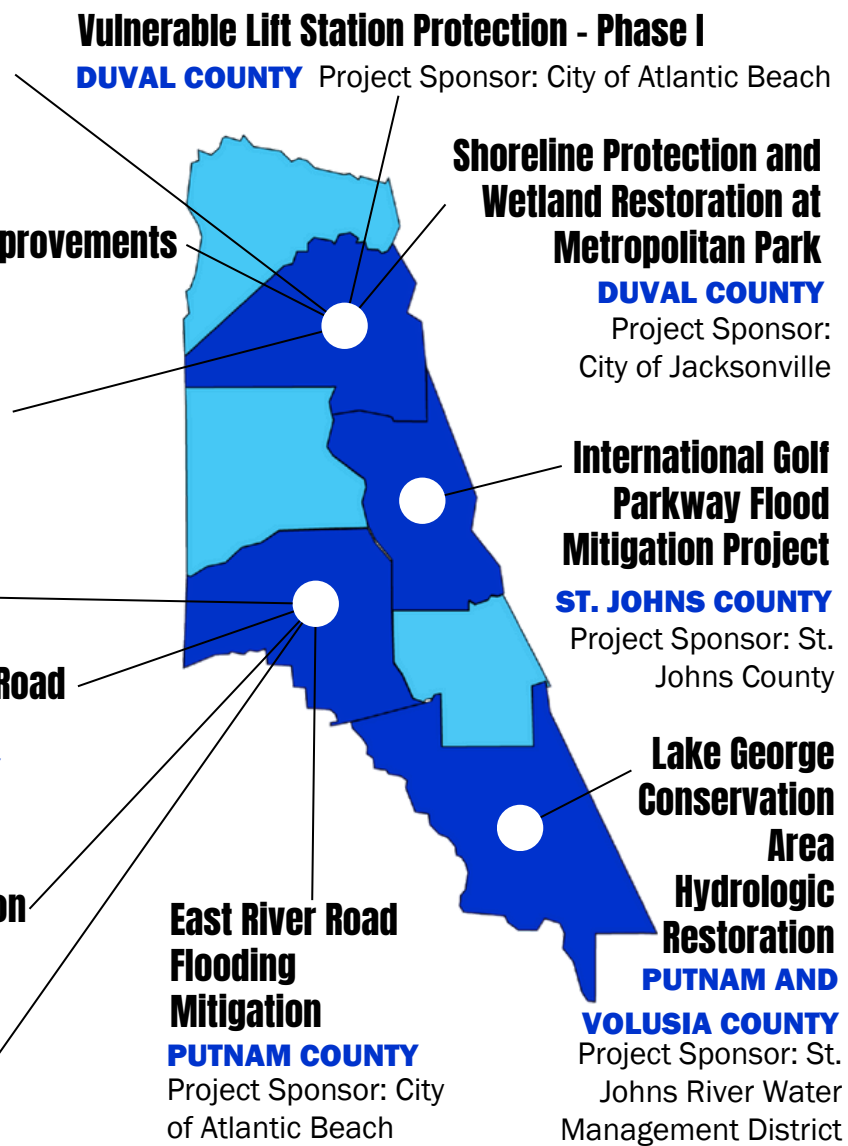

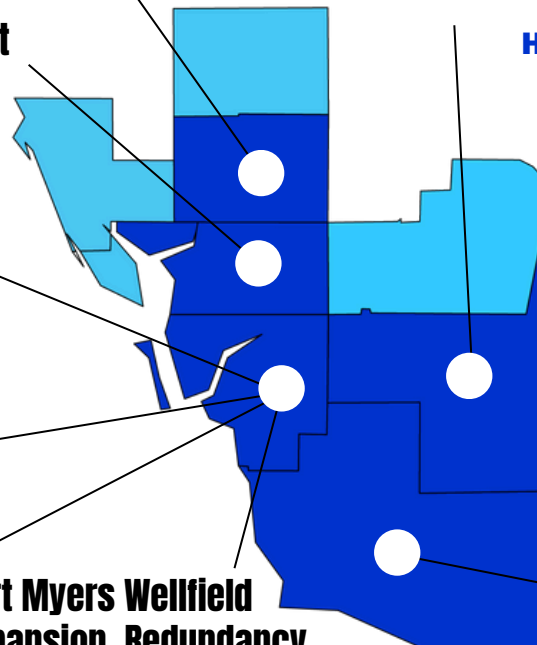

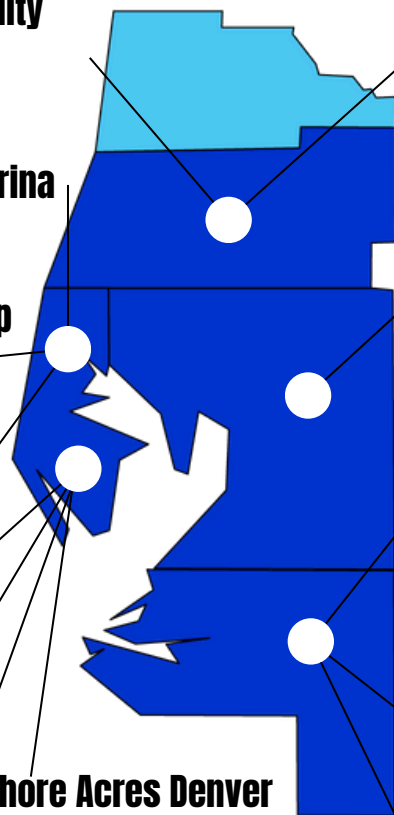
